



## Summer Packing List--Staff

Please label EVERY item with your name! A black sharpie is an ideal tool for this task.

- 8-10 tee shirts
- 8-10 underwear
- 1 light pajamas
- 1 heavy pajamas
- 4 jeans/long pants \*\*
- 2 swimming suits
- 10 pair socks
- 1 pair sneakers
- 1 pair of flip-flops or sandals
- Sturdy shoes/boots for hikes
- 5 pair shorts
- 2 sweaters/sweatshirts/fleece tops
- 1 additional pair of shoes that can get wet, such as water-socks, old sneakers or sandals for stream walks/canoeing
- 1 jacket or windbreaker
- Raincoat and Rain pants
- 1 cool long sleeve shirt (great for mosquitoes)\*\*

- Folk dance clothes
    - Girls: blouse and skirt or dress
    - Boys: nice shirt and slacks
  - Pillow
  - 1 blanket, 1 set of sheets,
  - Sleeping bag \*\*
  - 2-3 bath/beach towels
  - 2 washcloths
  - Laundry bag or basket
  - Tissues or hankies
  - Toiletries: soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, brush/comb, lip balm, deodorant if camper uses it
  - Stationery and stamps
  - Flashlight and at least one extra set of batteries for it
  - Sunscreen
  - Bug repellent
  - Water bottle: *At least 1 qt or liter*. Nalgene bottles are great – this item is essential!
  - Day pack for hikes\*\*
  - Baseball or sun hat
  - Reading material
  - Wrist/pocket watch to keep time (very important)

- Musical instruments/ music
  - Sketch pads/ pencils

- camera
- Journal/ diary
- Sports equipment: tennis racket, baseball mitt etc.
- Medications/vitamins
- One dressy outfit for our end of season banquet.

**\*\*All counselors help support our Wilderness Trip Leaders on a 1-3 night canoe/hiking trip for their camper group. When packing, please include some clothing that can also double as wilderness clothing. Sleeping bag and day pack should also be suitable for this purpose.**

As one of our goals at camp is to live simply and transcend some of the everyday distractions and intrusions of contemporary life, we ask that some items that may be part of camper's life at home or school not be brought to camp. These include ipods, cell phones, other electronic devices, as well as magazines, books, posters or clothing depicting drugs or alcohol, violent or sexual themes as well as "Babe" or "Hunk" magazines. **Staff may bring a cell phone and laptop computer but they may only be used on your day off, during a free period or otherwise not on duty, and not in the presence of campers.**
